Dear Brethren,

Thank you so much for your generous donation of \$3500 to assist us in providing relief and assistance to those affected by the tornado which ripped through Americus March 1. It has been a trying ordeal from which our city is sure to be long in recovering. Your concern for us and willingness to share in this challenge with us has been heartwarming and encouraging.

As you may know, among the 700 or so who had homes damaged, two of our own families at Williams Road were temporarily displaced from their homes. Both are now back at home, though repairs are continuing on their houses. Your donations have assisted these two families.

Two of our members also had their business buildings completely destroyed (see our website for photos www.williamsroadcoc.org). One of those is not yet back in business, and your donation has assisted in replacing some of that lost income. The other was operating from employee homes the day after the storm and now has a new location.

In all, 9 families have been given checks to assist with their repairs. For two others, we purchased materials and provided labor for repairs. Of these, some have been in the church and some are relatives and friends of our members.

We will continue to carefully disperse funds to those who have need so long as funds are available. In addition, we are providing work teams each Saturday to help with repairs and clean up, and we have been distributing a trailer of relief supplies provided by Churches of Christ Disaster Relief, Inc.

Much has been done and you, by your donation, have been part of that. We appreciate your thoughtfulness and generosity and pray that God will bless you richly so that you may continue to be a blessing to others.
